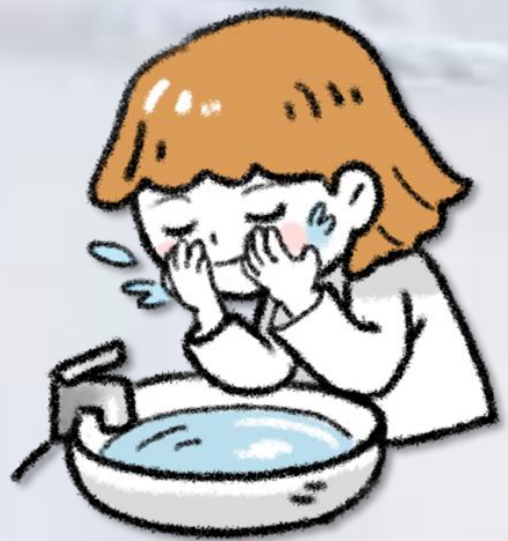

한국어 수업이 있어요.

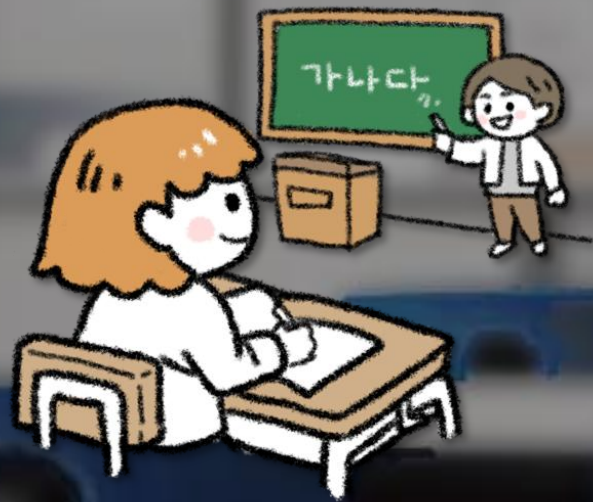

도서관에 가요.

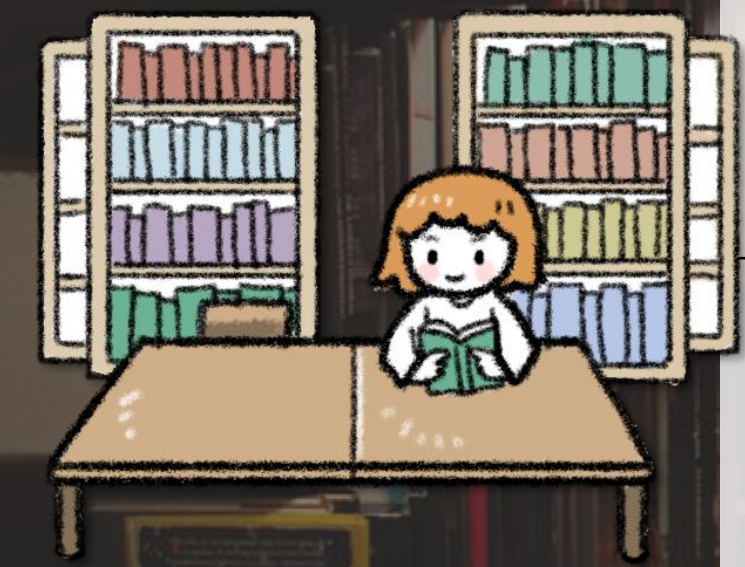

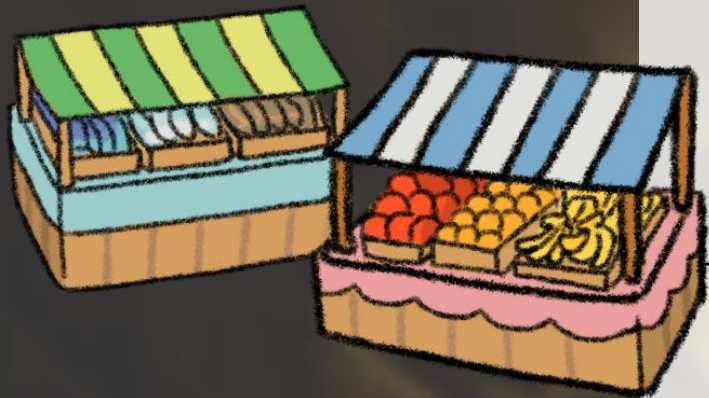

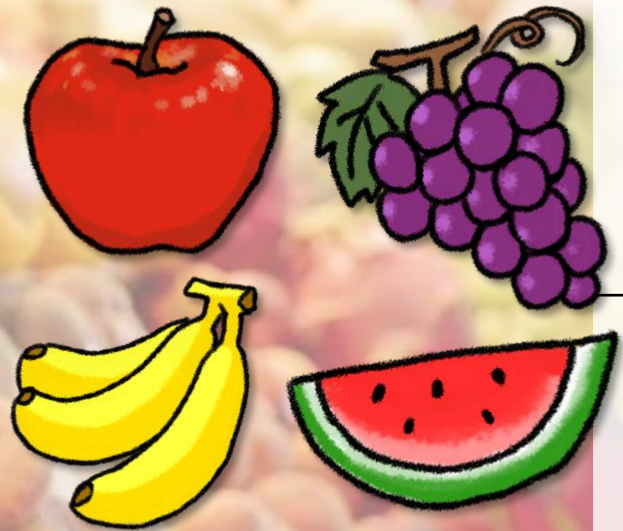

**쉬어요.**

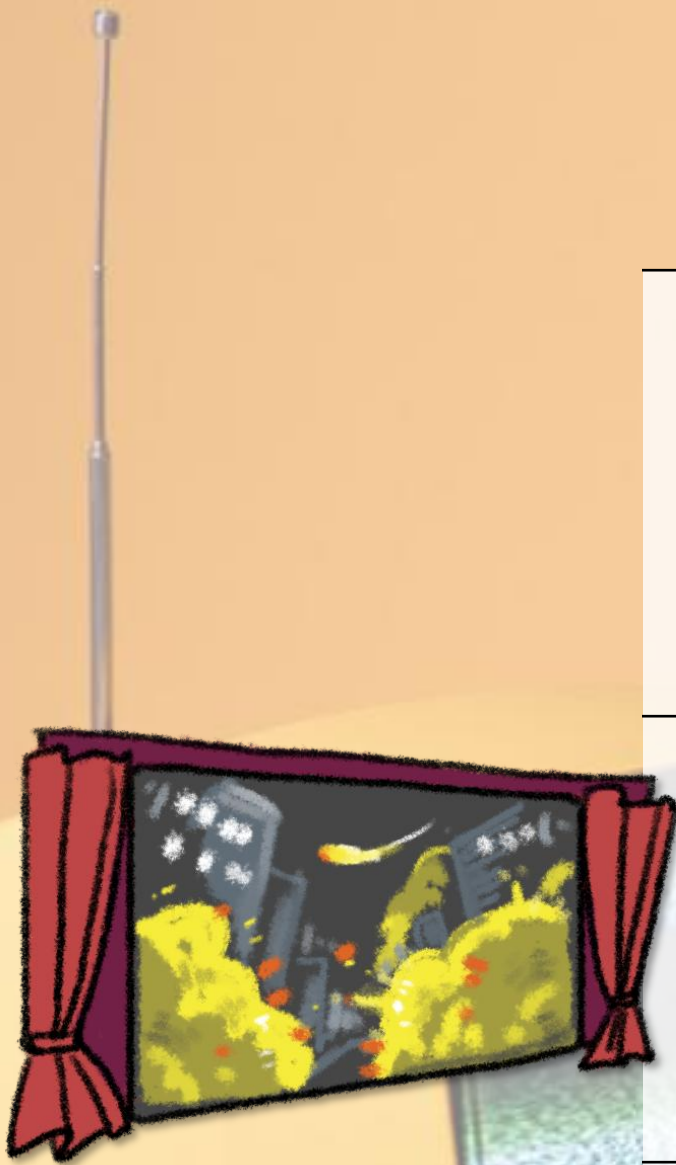

[ jam-eul jayo ]

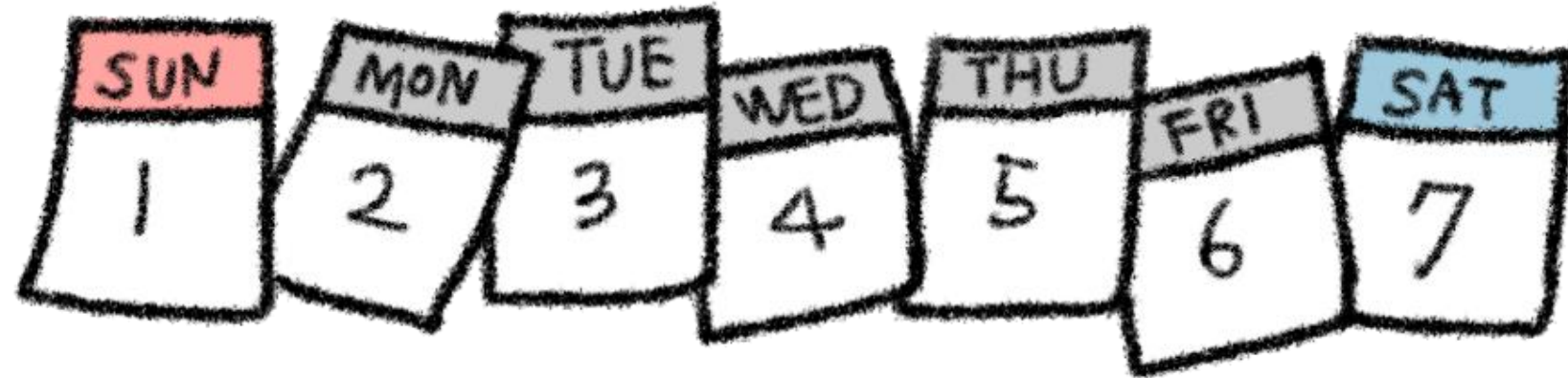
I sleep.
